What is the English Baccalaureate - EBacc?



The EBacc is a set of subjects made up of:

- English
- Maths
- The Sciences, including Computer Science
- History or Geography
- French or Spanish

To qualify for the EBacc, students who study a GCSE language should use Option 2 and Options 4 & 5 to choose either History or Geography (or both).


